In a special report released Thursday, July 5, 2007, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) ranked best among non-governmental organizations (NGOs) worldwide. From 34 global organizations, LCIF came in first for its execution of programs, demonstrated accountability, communications internally and externally, program adaptability to the surrounding community, and understanding the goals of its corporate supporters.

LCIF beat out Rotary International, Habitat for Humanity, UNESCO and UNICEF, to name a few on the list.

The ratings were compiled by the Financial Times in association with the Dalberg Global Development Advisers and the United Nations Global Compact. The assessment was published in the Financial Times' Corporate Citizenship and Philanthropy special report and highlights companies' growing interest in long-term partnerships to tackle an expanding range of social issues. The facilities, located on the original 14 acres first purchased by the founders, have morphed from a farm with numerous outbuildings to a superb residence center, a stellar kennel, and well-manicured grounds. This complex is home to our students, dogs; all services departments and the support staff that enable Leader Dog to enhance the lives of blind and visually impaired individuals from all over the world.

Services to assist in job skills and living skills education are on the immediate agenda. ## Governor Deb's Journey...

Bob and I visited Leader Dogs for the Blind the weekend of August 11 & 12 (pictures on the 5M4 website). During our visit we had the opportunity to learn about the entire program, including puppy evaluation, veterinary care, student admissions and training, and a presentation on how the harnesses and leashes are made.

Leader Dog is unique in the profession as it adapts modern technology in the form of hand held Global Positioning System (GPS), referred to as Trekker, for a blind person. Another part of this program is WorkCounts. The WorkCounts initiative is designed to provide employment opportunities and training in assistance technology for the workplace.

Highlights of the visit include 1) Walking blindfolded with a Leader Dog. For this walk I was blindfolded and teamed up with an instructor and a highly trained Leader Dog to gain a better understanding of living with visual impairment. 2) Hearing from a graduate about how his Leader Dog has given him independence and mobility. This was a true testimonial to the profound and positive impact a Leader Dog makes in the life of a person who is blind or visually impaired. 3) Being introduced as your representative from 5M4 was a very great honor. Multiple District 5M ranked second for donations for the Lions Year 2006 2007, only the Lions Clubs of Michigan contributed more than we. We can be extremely proud of this!!

Donations from MD5M for 2006 2007 were \$200,504.14. There was one dog placed with a new student and four placed as replacement dogs in MD5M during 2006 2007. In total, MD5M has received 237 dogs for service. Whew!! That's a lot of service dogs.

## 5M4 Mid-Winter Convention Constitution and Bylaws Notice

We are rapidly approaching the district convention. At the convention, any proposed amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws of District 5M4 will be considered.

Proposed amendments shall be submitted in writing and must state the rationale for the change, reference to the article and section affected and an exact wording to be replaced or added.

The proposed changes must be in the hands of the Constitution and Bylaws chairman by November 1, 2007. The committee will review the proposals and if they meet all of the specified criteria that are noted above, submit the proposed amendment to the Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer before December 1, 2007. Each club will receive a copy of the proposed amendments 30 days prior to the opening business session of the annual district convention.

If voted upon and approved, the amendments take effect at the close of the convention.

The Constitution and Bylaws committee may make clerical changes as needed. Such changes will be reported to the membership at the next annual convention.
